 - Supportive of SSHA connectivity in First Nations
 - Understand how big this issue is for Northern LHINS (104 communities)

- Penny:

 - What is it that our communities need to do to be heard?
 - Let the government know that we are in need of this service
 - We need eHealth in most of our communities
 - o Do we need to come up with more success stories?
 - We still need help/funding
 - We need to strengthen our capacity
 - o Youth and elders need stronger voices?
